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
New Door Hangers



We live on a planet where technology is increasing at an alarming rate. By the time you get used to using your current laptop, mobile phone, or tablet a new version comes out. These short-lived and disposable (but expensive) devices also require constant software updates. This means the user (you and me) has to adapt and conform to the way computer programmers have determined is best.

But what is BEST for the human mind and body? <u>Is today's technology truly providing a better way to live?</u> Is our generation any happier than past generations? Are people today doing life better than our ancestors? <u>Or do we experience more stress, more anxiety, more disease and perhaps even more suicides?</u> Undoubtedly you've heard of suicides by teens as a result of destructive social media posts and cyberbullying by fellow teens. When you stop to think about it, does social media actually provide better interaction than doing it the old fashion way—face to face?

Mobile devices have a great attraction to children and many have access to such a device. In fact nearly all teens in this country own a smartphone. But that pocket-sized electronic gadget could actually be impairing their physical, social and cognitive development. There is a negative fall out associated





with excessive use including behavioral and learning difficulties, impulsivity, anxiety and depression, poor short-term memory, inattention and obesity which is on the rise in children. It can also hinder the development of critical thinking and problem solving. Kids can even develop a screen addiction. Not to mention the destructive impact of all negative content and misinformation being pushed across the internet. Plus technology is advancing so fast that additional risks to children have yet to be uncovered.

The Mayo Clinic warns that too much screen time, including TV, video games, mobile devices and computers may have detrimental effects on children including: irregular sleep leading to fatigue, behavioral, emotional and attention problems, impaired academic performance, a greater acceptance of violence as a normal way to solve problems, and less play time and exercise. They recommend limiting screen time to no more than one or two hours a day.

However, research indicates that kids ages 8-12 spend an average of more than 5 hours a day on screens and consuming media. That number rises to more than 8 hours a day for teens! Parents are aware of the problem. One survey reported 71% of parents are worried children are spending too much time in front of screens. And we all know, the brain becomes what it feeds on!

The reason I'm concerned is that while there are benefits to an increase in technology, <u>research indicates</u> there are many and serious dangers, especially to children. Unless our children are protected by parental limits, they can be exposed to a horrible amount of evil content. 
