



Dear Partner,


Jesus died and rose again so that you and I can live—forever! That's the Good News which LifeTalk Radio is telling to the world. Your partnership is helping to make it possible. As the minds of many on this planet turn towards Easter, we are reminded of the life and death of Christ and the importance of staying connected with Him. I'm so thankful for this annual reminder that: God loves us, desires to deliver us and live through us. This is the message of Easter. We must tell it to the world!

The Bible tells us why Jesus came. Here are some of my favorite references that come to mind. I hope these Bible texts encourage you, and please share them during this Easter season. He came to give His life for us. "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" Mark 10:45.

He came to show us the truth. "In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth" John 18:37.

He died instead of us. "He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. He was handed over to die because of our sins, and He was raised from the dead to make us right with God" Romans 3:26 NLT.

He died to show us God's character of love. "But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" Romans 5:8.



He died that we might live for God. *“And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again”* 2 Corinthians 5:15.

He died to purify us. *“Who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for Himself a people that are His very own, eager to do what is good”* Titus 2:14.

He died to destroy the Devil and power of death. *“He too shared in their humanity so that by His death He might destroy him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil—and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death”* Hebrews 2:14-15.

He died so that we might die to sin and live for righteousness. *“He himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness”* 1 Peter 2:24.

He came to take away our sins. *“But you know that He appeared so that He might take away our sins”* 1 John 3:5.

He came that we might live through Him. *“This is how God showed His love among us: He sent His one and only Son into the world that we might live through Him”* 1 John 4:9. This is the message of Easter.

There is a wonderful Bible story told in John chapters 14 through 17. It’s the discourse between Jesus and His disciples in the upper room during the last supper. He tells them this life is temporary, that He is building homes in heaven, and will come back to take them there (see John 14:1-3).

Repeatedly in these chapters Jesus encourages His followers to ask for whatever they need. *“My Father will give you whatever you ask in my name”* John 16:23. Then in chapter 17 Jesus prays for them and for us. *“My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message”* John 17:20. Imagine, Jesus prayed for YOU!

Upon entering the upper room none of the disciples desired to wash another’s feet. So Jesus took it upon Himself to grab the basin and the towel and proceeded to wash their feet. Jesus is our example, showing how we should love and serve each other. This is the message of Easter. *“Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who...made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant...He humbled Himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross!”* Philippians 2:5-8.

Later that evening, in the garden, Jesus racked with pain exclaims, *“Not my will but Thine be done”* Luke 22:42. Again, Jesus is our example in showing us how to surrender our will to the will of God. This is the message of Easter. I’m so thankful that Jesus is our example in all

things and that He desires to live in and through us. *“For it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure”* Philippians 2:13. This is the message of Easter.

As you contemplate how your Savior did everything He could to save you, what are you willing to do for Him? Thank you for considering your partnership with LifeTalk as one way you demonstrate your love for God. Your participation makes it possible for broadcast radio to help connect people with Christ! ### Things Don’t Last Forever

Automobiles and radio kind of grew up together. In 1930 many American families owned a car. That same year, about 40% owned a radio, but within a decade radio ownership increased to 90%, surpassing car ownership and even indoor plumbing. In 1940 a radio could be purchased for \$15, the price of a car was \$850.

Radio towers and antennas began to appear as early as 1920 when commercial broadcasting began. Today we see radio and cell towers almost everywhere. A communication tower can range from \$15,000 to more than \$100,000. Building a commercial radio station can range from \$150,000 to over ten million. Thus you can see that broadcasting the Gospel involves a significant investment for LifeTalk.

So here is a question: How many cars and radios has your family owned through the years? Things don’t last forever and need to be replaced from time to time. Likely none of the original 1920 radio towers still exist. Over the past century these have needed replacement. The same is true for LifeTalk. At the moment, we have a serious need to replace one of our radio antennas. The cost will be over \$10,000 and we need your immediate help. Without good equipment it’s not possible to get the Good News to people needing to hear it.
