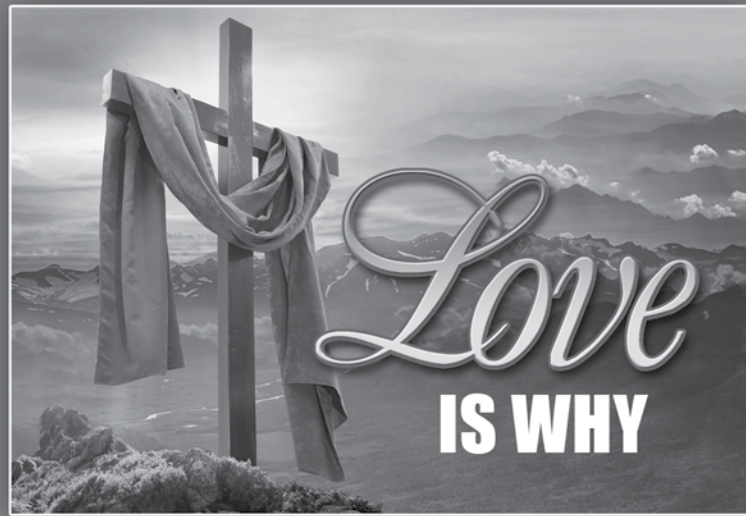

Dear Partner,

Millions of people around the world are asking, "Where's my home?" Many have lost their homes due to war. All that's left is a pile of rubble. Imagine being in that situation. They live on the streets, underneath freeways, near garbage dumps or worse. They realize something is desperately wrong with life on this planet. They sense that "this world is not my home."

While on this earth, Jesus also never had a home. He said, "*Foxes have holes and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head.*" Luke 9:58. Think



about that for a moment. Jesus was homeless. If he were here today, would you share your home with him? What are you doing to share with others? Jesus said, “*when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!*” Matthew 25:40 NLT

Jesus has promised each of us a home in heaven. “*Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father’s house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also.*” John 14:1-3

For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.*” Matthew 6:31-34. Even though this planet is in a terrible state, God is still in control and has promised to meet our daily needs. We have no reason to worry. That’s the hope and assurance we must share with the rest of the world.



pain, destruction and death. I eagerly anticipate that day, when Jesus will “*destroy him who holds the power of death.*” Hebrews 2:14


